



The Department of Housing, Planning & Local Government Homelessness Report July 2017

The long-term solution to the current homeless issue is to increase the supply of homes. Rebuilding Ireland: Action Plan on Housing and Homelessness is designed to accelerate all types of housing supply – social, private and rental. In particular, Rebuilding Ireland seeks the delivery of increased volumes of social housing over the coming years (47,000 units by 2021) and places a focus on delivering long-term housing solutions for homeless households. Successes are being achieved in this regard, for example:

- over 3,000 exited homelessness into independent tenancies in 2016;
- in the first 6 months of this year over 1,800 exited homelessness into independent tenancies;
- to date in 2017, 500 households in Dublin received supports preventing them from entering homelessness;
- during July in Dublin 88 households exited homelessness and 75 households received supports preventing them from entering homelessness.

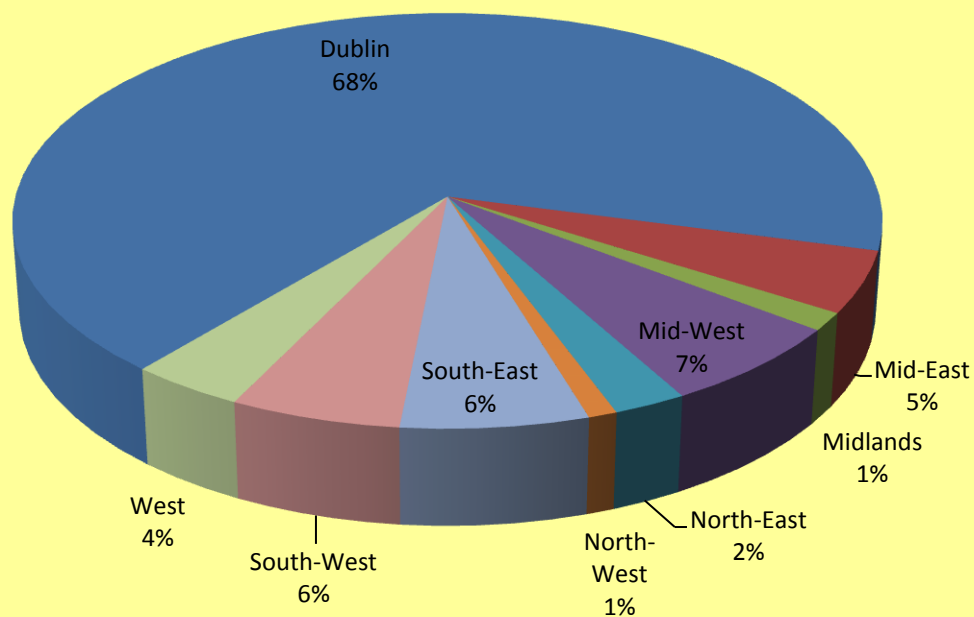
PEA - Private Emergency Accommodation: this may include hotels, B&Bs and other residential facilities that are used on an emergency basis
